## PRESENTATION OF ACCREDITATION DIPLOMAS OF FIVE ACCREDITED LABORATORIES IN SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER 2019

**SOAC** has accredited **five** additional **laboratories** in September and October 2019. These results were obtained with the assistance of the West African Quality System Program (**WAQSP**) of the ECOWAS and UEMOA Commissions, financed by the European Union (**EU**), executed by the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (**UNIDO**).



Burkina Faso stands out with two accredited laboratories, including the cotton fiber quality control laboratory of the National Textile Fibers Society (SOFITEX) and the food chemistry laboratory of the Department of Food Technology DTA / IRSAT, accredited for the lodine analysis in salt.





As regards **calibration**, the National calibration laboratory (**LANEMA**), **Côte d'Ivoire** (**CI**), has been **accredited** in the field of temperature. The certificate was officially presented to the Ivorian Minister of Trade and Industry, Mr. DIARASSOUBA, on September 23, 2019, during the Opening Ceremony of the 10th General Assembly of the African Accreditation Cooperation (AFRAC), which was hosted by SOAC in Abidjan. This result reinforces calibration skills in West Africa, which remain low: less than 10 laboratories registered so far.

In the field of health and medical biology, the **RETROCI** laboratory – Côte d'Ivoire, joins

the still very small circle (less than 20 laboratories identified in West AFrica) laboratories accredited according to **ISO 15189.** Finally, the specialized forensic analysis field registers its first accredited laboratory in SOAC Member States, with the Directorate of the Central Police Laboratory (**DLCP**) which is thus among the pioneers in this
