- **UEMOA region:** the Member States of the West African Economic and Monetary Union (Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Guinea Bissau, Mali, Niger, Senegal, Togo)
- **ECOWAS region:** the Member States of the Economic Community of West African States (Benin, Burkina Faso, Cape Verde, Côte d'Ivoire, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea Bissau, Liberia, Mali, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Togo)
- Foreign region: Conformity Assessment Body established outside the ECOWAS region
- **UEMOA:** West Africa Economic and Monetary Union
- **ECOWAS:** Economic Community of West Africa States

# 7 Process description

As the only authorized accreditation body in the eight-member states of the West Africa Economic and Monetary Union (UEMOA), SOAC is committed to focusing its services on bodies that are established within the Union.

However, the purpose of this document is to detail the procedure to be followed when SOAC receives an application from a conformity assessment body that is not based within its Member States.

Within West Africa, the rules on cross-frontier accreditation are tightly governed by the ECOWAS Accreditation System (ECORAS) Regulation C/REG/10/6/17 on the text on the organization and operation of the Regional Accreditation System (ECORAS). Regulation C/REG/10/6/17states that Accreditation bodies shall respect the principle of territoriality: a

conformity assessment body (CAB) seeking accreditation shall do so only from the Accreditation Body covering the country where it is established. So far, concerned countries are Ghana (GhaNAS, the Ghanaian Accreditation Body), Nigeria (NiNAS, the Nigerian Accreditation Body) and UEMOA Member States (Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Guinea Bissau, Mali, Niger, Senegal and Togo with SOAC).

For SOAC Cross-Frontier Accreditation in the rest of the World, specifically the five remaining countries in West Africa: Cape Verde, the Gambia, Guinea, Liberia, Sierra Leone, guidance is provided by two international accreditation groups.

These two groups are the International Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation (ILAC) and the International Accreditation Forum (IAF). Therefore, whilst not banning accreditation bodies from offering accreditation to CABs from outside its borders, SOAC will promote the multilateral agreements of both ILAC and IAF, and inform interested parties that accreditation should be sought from the local accreditation body. Further details on the guidance provided on international Cross-frontier accreditation can be found in IAF Mandatory Document MD12 and ILAC Guidance Document G-21. SOAC is also taking into account when existing, the mandatory regulation vis-à-vis accreditation in the country where the CAB is established. According to its Rules of Procedure, Section on Territoriality, SOAC undertakes, with the agreement of the candidate for Accreditation, to proceed with the subsequent transfer of the Accreditation to the national body once the latter has been established.
